At St Laurence the children in receipt of pupil premium can be coping with and facing a number of barriers to learning. Research into Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs helps us to understand that until a child feels ready to learn they are unlikely to reach their full potential. Some of the identified barriers to learning that our pupil premium children need support to overcome include:

- unmet physical and emotional needs
- lack of self-esteem and low self confidence
- parents' own experiences of education can impair engagement with child's education
- speech and language needs including those who have English as a second language (EAL)
- identified Special Educational Needs (SEN) for approximately 20% of our Pupil premium children
- vulnerability to under achievement
