This week in Kestrels we have had a busy week.


We have been busy in English writing an adventure story all about a terrible weather event. It has to be very exciting and really capture the reader's imagination and interest. We have been working on all the exciting vocabulary we will be using in our story.

In Maths, in Year 5 and 6, we have been exploring fractions and using fractions to solve challenging word problems. We know that we need to know our times tables really fluently to help us with our Maths each day.

In Science, we were able to explore electricity and working in groups we constructed various circuits. We created series circuits and challenged ourselves to construct parallel circuits which is similar to what is used in domestic homes.

We are going on to create a game using electrical circuits next week.









Inspirational People is our focus in RE this week and we looked at The Beatitudes as a set of teachings from Jesus to live our lives by each day. In groups, we read a story related to each Beatitude and then used drama to bring this alive to the rest of the class.

On Wednesday we were visited by the Cambridge mental health team who gave us an assembly on how to regulate our emotions and recognising when we get upset or angry. The team gave us really useful ways to control our strong emotions and reflect on the effect we have on other people's emotions around us.

We were lucky to be visited by an upcoming author (Toke's Mum) who read some of her exciting book based on the Mayan people. It was a mixture of non-fiction and fiction and we were all transfixed by this fascinating story. We all had a chance to ask her questions about becoming an author and how to write a story like this.

Netball is this half term's learning in PE and we have been using different passing techniques and playing mini-games. It is a fast-paced game and requires a lot of great communication and teamwork.

Following on from our project on 'Friendship' some of the children are digging holes to plant our friendship trees which will be near Kestrels' classroom. This is a reminder to be kind and caring with adults and children alike.

### Making Storytelling Open To All



#### An Online Workshop Monday 20 February 2023: 7pm-8pm via Zoom

<u>Talking Together in Cambridgeshire</u> will be welcoming internationally acclaimed, inclusive storyteller, Cassandra Wye to deliver her online Making Storytelling Open To All workshop ahead of this year's <u>Festival of Stories</u>. By holding the workshop in advance of the festival, those working in the early years, parents and carers will have the opportunity to practice the inclusive storytelling techniques, so they can try out the ideas for themselves when sharing stories with little ones over the festival period and beyond.

Throughout this session early years practitioners, parents and carers will have the opportunity to explore the range of storytelling techniques we can use to enable storytelling to be accessible to every audience, including children who are learning to speak more than one language and children with special educational needs or disabilities.

Cassandra will be performing her Take A Little Walk Little Bear sensory story, which is suitable for children aged 2-5 years, on two occasions later in the festival period. She will be using the Little Bear story as the focus for the workshops, so those attending the workshops will then be able to see how she uses the techniques in practice when delivering the storytelling sessions.

This 1-hour workshop will include:

- An interactive demonstration on inclusive storytelling with Little Bear
- An interactive discussion on the techniques demonstrated and how they enhance communication and engagement in storytelling
- Breakout room discussion on how to apply the techniques demonstrated to any storytelling session

This online training is free for parents, carers, and early years educators to access.

This session will be delivered for a second time on: Wednesday 8 March 2023 from 7pm-8pm.










# Supporting people in need this winter


Increasing costs of living have stretched many families – if you are one of them, we can help – we can call, visit & listen, and provide practical financial support where needed.
