What is Lent?



Lent is the solemn Christian religious observance in the liturgical year commemorating the 40 days Jesus Christ spent fasting in the desert and enduring temptation by Satan, according to the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, before beginning his public ministry.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.

During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully.

Rules

On Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent: **Everyone of age 14** and up must abstain from consuming meat. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday: Everyone of age 18 to 59 must fast, unless exempt due to usually a medical reason.



Over the last two weeks, the Quails have had World Book Day, which saw some very colourful characters such as Dog man. As part of World Book Day the pupils in Quails were given the chance to create a comic book. The comics will be judged next Thursday. The pupils have loved this task and it has encouraged some children to widen their reading choices.






