



Year 3/4 Classes – Curriculum Overview for the Week: Monday 9th September – Friday 13th September



Maths

In Maths this week we are learning about place value
The Year 3 children will:

- Learn to count in 100s to 1,000
- Understand that a number up to 1,000 is made of some 100s, some 10s and some 1s
- Represent numbers in place value grids and write 3-digit numbers in multiple ways
- Identify values and mark points on number lines that go up in 100s, 10s and 1s

The Year 4 children will:

- Recap their understanding of numbers to 1,000
- Be introduced to rounding to the nearest 10 and 100
- Count in 1,000s from 0 to 10,000 forwards and backwards
- Represent 4-digit numbers using base 10 equipment and part-whole models



English

In English this week we will be looking at traditional tales, using 'Cinderella of the Nile' by Beverley Naidoo as a stimulus, the children will:

- Compare cultural versions of the same fairy tale
- Identify the genre of a text
- Retell a traditional tale
- Learn about prepositional phrases and how to use them in their writing.



Topic

Tombs, Temples and Treasures

This week the children will start their IPC topic on Ancient Egyptians. In art they will be designing and making Egyptian necklaces and bracelets. On Friday we will be having an 'Egyptian Day'. Children are to come dressed up as an Egyptian for the day. This could be as simple as a white sheet (with a belt for a robe).



RE

This week the children will explore what it means to be part of a Christian family and the family of the church. They will be discussing how they are part of a family and sharing special traditions or events.
